Welcome

(SITTING)

W ELCOME to this evening's observance of Good Friday. Our service includes several ancient Good Friday traditions. The BIDDING PRAYERS are petitions contained in the Collects from the Book of Common Prayer ending with the Lord's Prayer. THE REPROACHES contrast God's goodness with the faithlessness of God's people in a series of versicles and responses. The TENEBRAE is a Latin word that means "darkness" or "shadows." The service comes from the monastic tradition where, along with other daily worship, "Tenebrae" was the last service on the eves of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.

Tonight, we will hear again the Passion narrative from the four Gospels. We will witness our Saviour's betrayal in the Garden; we will travel the Via Dolorosa (or Way of Sorrows) with Him; we will hear His last words; and we will lay His body in the tomb. In keeping with the Tenebrae tradition, the candles and lights within the Church will gradually be extinguished until we are left sitting in total darkness. This darkness symbolizes the apparent victory of the powers of darkness at Jesus' death and the darkness that covered the earth during the crucifixion. After each passage, I will ask a different parishioner to come forth and extinguish a candle to stress our participation in the rejection and death of our Messiah. Once in darkness, we will sound the strepitus (loud noise) symbolizing the earthquake that occurred when Jesus died and the sound of the stone being rolled in front of the tomb. At this point the service is over. We will exit the Church in silence and return home contemplating the silence and darkness of the tomb in which our Savior was laid. We must also contemplate the darkness of our sin that led our Savior to the Cross.

But we also remember that our redemption is not accomplished solely by His death. We must come to His empty tomb on Sunday morn and celebrate the Resurrection and His victory over death. For without the Resurrection, His death means nothing.

Let us now petition God to behold and bless us as we worship Him and meditate upon the crucifixion of Jesus Christ the Messiah.

Take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of thy Word; and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to thy fold, that they may be made one flock under one shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. **Amen.**

THE AGONY OF GETHSEMANE

Lesson 1

T HEN cometh Jesus with them unto a place called Gethsemane, and saith unto the disciples, "Sit ye here, while I go and pray yonder." And he took with him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, and began to be sorrowful and very heavy. Then saith he unto them, "My soul is exceeding sorrowful, even unto death; tarry ye here, and watch with me." And he went a little further, and fell on his face, and prayed, saying, "O my Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as thou wilt." And he cometh unto the disciples, and findeth them asleep, and saith unto Peter, "What, could ye not watch with me one hour? Watch and pray, that ye enter not into temptation: the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." He went away again the second time, and prayed, saying, "O my Father, if this cup may not pass away from me, except I drink it, thy will be done." And he came and found them asleep again: for their eyes were heavy. And he left them, and went away again, and prayed the third time, saying the same words. (Matthew 26:36-44) And there appeared an angel unto him from heaven, strengthening him. And being in an agony he prayed more earnestly: and his sweat was as it were great drops of blood falling down to the ground. (Luke 22:43-44) Then cometh he to his disciples, and saith unto them, "Sleep on now, and take your rest: behold, the hour is at hand, and the Son of man is betrayed into the hands of sinners." (Matthew 26:45)

ND immediately, while he yet spake, cometh Judas, one of the twelve, ${f A}$ and with him a great multitude with swords and staves, from the chief priests and the scribes and the elders. And he that betrayed him had given them a token, saying, "Whomsoever I shall kiss, that same is he; take him, and lead him away safely." And as soon as he was come, he goeth straightway to him, and saith, Master, master; and kissed him. (Mark 14:43-45) But Jesus said unto him, "Judas, betrayest thou the Son of man with a kiss?" When they which were about him saw what would follow, they said unto him, Lord, shall we smite with the sword? (Luke 22:48-49) Then Simon Peter having a sword drew it, and smote the high priest's servant, and cut off his right ear. The servant's name was Malchus. (John 18:10) Then said Jesus unto Him, "Put up again thy sword into his place: for all they that take the sword shall perish with the sword. Thinkest thou that I cannot now pray to my Father, and he shall presently give me more than twelve legions of angels? But how then shall the Scriptures be fulfilled, that thus it must be?" In that same hour said Jesus to the multitudes, "Are ye come out as against a thief with swords and staves for to take me? I sat daily with you teaching in the temple, and ye laid no hold on me." But all this was done, that the Scriptures of the prophets might be fulfilled. Then all the disciples forsook him, and fled. (Matthew 26:52-56)

T HEN led they Jesus from Caiaphas unto the hall of judgment: and it was early; and they themselves went not into the judgment hall, lest they should be defiled; but that they might eat the passover. Pilate then went out unto them, and said, "What accusation bring ye against this man?" They answered and said unto him, "If he were not a malefactor, we would not have delivered him up unto thee." Then said Pilate unto them, "Take ye him, and judge him according to your law." The Jews therefore said unto him, "It is not lawful for us to put any man to death:" That the saying of Jesus might be fulfilled, which he spake, signifying what death he should die. Then Pilate entered into the judgment hall again, and called Jesus, and said unto him, "Art thou the King of the Jews?" Jesus answered him, "Sayest thou this thing of thyself, or did others tell it thee of me?" Pilate answered, "Am I a Jew? When he was set down on the judgment seat, his wife sent unto him, saying, "Have thou nothing to do with that just man: for I have suffered many things this day in a dream because of him." But the chief priests and elders persuaded the multitude that they should ask Barabbas, and destroy Jesus. The governor answered and said unto them, "Whether of the twain will ye that I release unto you?" They said, Barabbas.
