¶ Minister:

A LMIGHTY God, unto whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid; Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of thy Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love thee, and worthily magnify thy holy Name; through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

¶ Turning to the people, the minister continues:

Hear what our Lord Jesus Christ saith,

T HOU shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets.

(SITTING)


<u>Lector:</u> The Epistle lesson is written in the 8th chapter of the St. Paul's Epistle to the Romans beginning at the 18th verse.

I RECKON that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us. For the earnest expectation of the creature waiteth for the manifestation of the sons of God. For the creature was made subject to vanity, not willingly, but by reason of him who hath subjected the same in hope, because the creature itself also shall be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God. For we know that the whole creation groaneth and travaileth in pain together until now. And not only they, but ourselves also, which have the firstfruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting for the adoption, to wit, the redemption of our body.

Congregation SINGS:



B E ye therefore merciful, as your Father also is merciful. Judge not, and ye shall not be judged: condemn not, and ye shall not be condemned: forgive, and ye shall be forgiven: give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall

men give into your bosom. For with the same measure that ye mete withal it shall be measured to you again. And he spake a parable unto them, Can the blind lead the blind? shall they not both fall into the ditch? The disciple is not above his master: but every one that is perfect shall be as his master. And why beholdest thou the mote that is in thy brother's eye, but perceivest not the beam that is in thine own eye? Either how canst thou say to thy brother, Brother, let me pull out the mote that is in thine eye, when thou thyself beholdest not the beam that is in thine own eye? Thou hypocrite, cast out first the beam out of thine own eye, and then shalt thou see clearly to pull out the mote that is in thy brother's eye.

HOLY BAPTISM (ADULT)

(STANDING)

HYMN #258 "Wash, O God, our sons and daughters"

 \P The sponsor(s) and persons to be baptized shall gather around the font. The Presbyter shall ask,

Has this Person been already baptized, or no?

 \P If they answer, No, then shall the Presbyter proceed as follows.

D EARLY beloved, forasmuch as all men are conceived and born in sin; and that our Saviour Christ saith, None can enter into the kingdom of God, except he be regenerate and born anew of Water and of the Holy Ghost; I beseech you to call upon God the Father, through our Lord Jesus Christ, that of his bounteous mercy he will grant to *this Person* that which by nature *she* cannot have; that *she* may be baptized with Water and the Holy Ghost, and received into Christ's holy Church, and be made living members of the same.

Minister. Let us pray.

A LMIGHTY and immortal God, the aid of all who need, the helper of all who flee to thee for succour, the life of those who believe, and the resurrection of the dead; We call upon thee for this Person, that she, coming to thy holy Baptism, may receive remission of her sins, by spiritual regeneration. Receive her, O Lord, as thou hast promised by thy well-beloved Son, saying, Ask, and ye shall have; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you. So give now unto us who ask; let us who seek, find; open the gate unto us who knock; that this Person may enjoy the everlasting benediction of thy heavenly washing, and may come to the eternal kingdom which thou hast promised by Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

¶ Then shall the Minister read following passage,

Hear the words of the Gospel, written by Saint John, in the third chapter, at the first verse.

THERE was a man of the Pharisees, named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews: the same came to Jesus by night, and said unto him, Rabbi, we know that thou art a teacher come from God: for no man can do these miracles that thou doest, except God be with him. Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God. Nicodemus saith unto him, How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter the second time into his mother's womb, and be born? Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again. The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound thereof; but canst not tell whence it cometh, and whither it goeth: so is every one that is born of the Spirit.

¶ Then shall the Minister say,

A ND now, being persuaded of the good will of our heavenly Father toward this Person, declared by his Son Jesus Christ let us feeth 6-11 🚺 by his Son Jesus Christ; let us faithfully and devoutly give thanks unto him, and say,

¶ Minister and people.

LMIGHTY and everlasting God, heavenly Father, We give thee humble thanks, that $m{ au}$ thou hast vouchsafed to call us to the knowledge of thy grace, and faith in thee: Increase this knowledge, and confirm this faith in us evermore. Give thy Holy Spirit to this Person, that she may be born again, and be made an heir of everlasting salvation; through our Lord Jesus Christ, who liveth and reigneth with thee and the same Holy Spirit, now and for ever. Amen.

¶ The Presbyter shall speak unto the person to be baptized the following.

7 ELL-BELOVED, *ye* have come hither desiring to receive holy Baptism. We have prayed that our Lord Jesus Christ would vouchsafe to receive you and bless you, to release you from your sins, to give you the kingdom of heaven, and everlasting life.

O you renounce the devil and all his works, the vain pomp and glory of the world, with all covetous desires of the same, and the sinful desires of the flesh, so that you will not follow, nor be led by them?

I renounce them all. Answer.

Minister. Do you believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth?

> And in Jesus Christ his only begotten Son our Lord? And that he was conceived by the Holy Ghost; born of the Virgin Mary; that he suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; that he went down into hell, and also did rise again the third day; that he ascended into heaven, and sitteth at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; and from thence shall come again at the end of the world, to judge the quick and the dead?

And do you believe in the Holy Ghost; the holy Catholic Church; the Communion of Saints; the Remission of sins; the Resurrection of the body; and everlasting Life after death?

Answer. All this I steadfastly believe.

Minister. Will you be baptized in this Faith?

Answer. That is my desire.

Minister. Will you then obediently keep God's holy will and commandments, and walk in the

same all the days of your life?

Answer. I will, by God's help.

 \P Then shall the Presbyter say the following.

MERCIFUL God, grant that the old Adam in *this Person* may be so buried, that the new man may be raised up in *her*. **Amen.**

Grant that all sinful affections may die in *her*, and that all things belonging to the Spirit may live and grow in *her*. **Amen.**

Grant that *she* may have power and strength to have victory, and to triumph, against the devil, the world, and the flesh. **Amen.**

Grant that *she*, being here dedicated to thee by our office and ministry, may also be endued with heavenly virtues, and everlastingly rewarded, through thy mercy, O blessed Lord God, who dost live, and govern all things, world without end. **Amen.**

Minister. The Lord be with you. **People.** And with thy spirit.

Minister. Lift up your hearts.

People.We lift them up unto the Lord.Minister.Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

People. It is meet and right so to do.

 \P Then shall the Presbyter consecrate the Water, saying,

I T is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should give thanks unto thee, O Lord, Holy Father, Almighty, Everlasting God, for that thy dearly beloved Son Jesus Christ, for the forgiveness of our sins, did shed out of his most precious side both water and blood; and gave commandment to his disciples, that they should go teach all nations, and baptize them In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Regard, we beseech thee, the supplications of thy congregation; ▼ sanctify this Water to the mystical washing away of sin; and grant that these Persons, now to be baptized therein, may receive the fullness of thy grace, and ever remain in the number of thy faithful and elect children; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, now and evermore. **Amen.**¶

¶ Then the Presbyter shall take each person by the right hand, and shall say to the sponsor,

Name this Person.

 \P And then, naming the child (or person) accordingly, he shall sprinkle or pour Water upon him, or else shall dip him in the Water discreetly, saying,

 ${f B}$ OLUWATIFE AYOMIDE, I baptize thee In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. **Amen.**

¶ Then the Presbyter shall say,

E receive *this Person* into the congregation of Christ's flock; and do sign *her* with the sign of the Cross, in token that hereafter *she* shall not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified, and manfully to fight under his banner, against sin, the world, and the devil; and to continue Christ's faithful soldier and servant unto *her* life's end. **Amen.**

¶ Then shall the Presbyter light a candle and present it saying,

 ${f R}$ ECEIVE the light of our Lord Jesus Christ who said: 'I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of Life.' **Amen.**

¶ Then shall the Presbyter say,

S EEING now, dearly beloved brethren, that *this Person is* regenerate, and grafted into the body of Christ's Church, let us give thanks unto Almighty God for these benefits; and with one accord make our prayers unto him, that *this Person* may lead the rest of *her life* according to this beginning.

¶ Minister and People

UR Father, who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, On earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, But deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

¶ Then shall the Presbyter say,

E yield thee hearty thanks, most merciful Father, that it hath pleased thee to regenerate this Person with thy Holy Spirit, to receive her for thine own Child by adoption, and to incorporate her into thy holy Church. And humbly we beseech thee to grant, that she, being dead unto sin, and living unto righteousness, and being buried with Christ in his death, may crucify the old man, and utterly abolish the whole body of sin; and that, as she is made partaker of the death of thy Son, she may also be partaker of his resurrection; so that finally, with the residue of thy holy Church, she may be an inheritor of thine everlasting kingdom; through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

¶ Then may the Presbyter use this Exhortation following; speaking to the sponsor first.

PORASMUCH as this Person has promised in your presence to renounce the devil and all his works, to believe in God, and to serve him; ye must remember, that it is your part and duty to put her in mind, what a solemn vow, promise, and profession she has now made before this congregation, and especially before you his chosen witness. And ye are also to call upon her to use all diligence to be rightly instructed in God's holy Word; that so she may grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ, and live godly, righteously, and soberly in this present world.

¶ If the Exhortation to the sponsors be said, then, speaking to the newly baptized persons, the Presbyter shall say,

A ND as for you, who have now by Baptism put on Christ, it is your part and duty also, being made the child of God and of the light, by faith in Jesus Christ, to walk answerably to your Christian calling, and as becometh the children of light; remembering always that Baptism representeth unto us our profession; which is, to follow the example of our Saviour Christ, and to be made like unto him; that as he died, and rose again for us; so should we, who are baptized, die from sin, and rise again unto righteousness; continually mortifying all our evil and corrupt affections, and daily proceeding in all virtue and godliness of living.

¶ Then, the Presbyter shall add,

The Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named; Grant you to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man; that, Christ dwelling in your hearts by faith, ye may be filled with all the fullness of God. **Amen.**

 \P The Congregation may congratulate and welcome the newest member(s) of Christ's Church.

Hear what comfortable words our Saviour Christ saith unto all who truly turn to him.

Hear also what Saint John saith.





A LL glory be to thee, Almighty God, our heavenly Father, for that thou, of thy tender mercy, didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the Cross for our redemption; who made there (by his one oblation of himself once offered) a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction, for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of that his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again: For in the night in which he was betrayed, he took Bread; and when he had given thanks, he brake it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you; Do this in remembrance of me. Likewise, after supper, he took the Cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all of this; for this is my Blood of the New Testament, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins; Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me.

ND we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness, mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise $m{\Lambda}$ and thanksgiving; most humbly beseeching thee to grant that, by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we, and all thy whole Church, may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion. 
